Learning outcomes

By the end of the lesson, pupils will be able to: recognise which household articles should only be used by adults and which ones have been designed for children to play with; and also gain a brief understanding of the role and words that a firefighter might use; and how they dress to protect themselves.

Tools Not Toys sorting game - (use laminated images)

At the beginning, highlight that tools are dangerous; should only be used by grownups; and should never be played with.

The pupils stand in the middle of the room. Place the **SAFE** card on the far left of the room and the **DANGEROUS** card on the right of the room. Shuffle the A4 cards face down and ask a pupil to choose one. Turn the card over and show it to the class. Ask them to run to either the **SAFE** side or **DANGEROUS** side of the room on the count of 3.






Watch the video then cut out and dress the firefighter. Cut out the titles and place them next to the appropriate item of clothing.


